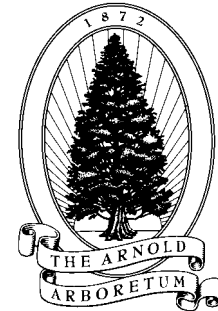

GRADUATE STUDENT FELLOWSHIPS IN TROPICAL FOREST ECOLOGY

University and the Smithsonian Tropical Research Institute

The National Institute of Education (NIE), Singapore, has an active program of graduate studies in Biological Sciences. The Center for Tropical Science-Arnold Arboretum (CTFS-AA) Asia program coordinates a network of long-term ecological research programs in the tropical forests of seven Asian countries. NIE and CTFS-AA collaborate in research and training on the tropical forests of the region. NIE is offering International Ph.D. fellowships in forest ecology. Under this fellowship scheme, successful candidates will be supervised by an International team of tropical ecologists from NIE and CTFS-AA. Candidates should have strong undergraduate or Masters degrees specializing in biology, ecology, botany or environmental science. TOEFL and GRE scores are required for admission to the NIE graduate program. Fellowships include a stipend of up to SGD\$1,500 per month and research support.
